Type in Free VIN check or Free VIN Decoder in any search engine and you will find numerous websites offering such a service. Unfortunately, most will provide a basic VIN breakdown or limited history details with the option to purchase a full detailed report for a small price

If you're buying or selling a car I suggest paying for such a <u>vehicle history service</u>. If selling it can be advertised as having a clean history with documented proof if buying and I always carry out a check before I buy even for a car Im selling on. Don't be afraid to ask the seller especially if it's a dealer to carry out the check for you. This is best done towards the end of any negotiation prior to parting with any cash when the seller is sure of your interest and he is happy it will seal the deal.

If your wiling to spend a small amount of time researching a vehicles background, then there is information you can search from Government websites and other motoring organisations for vehicle history or VIN decoded details totally free of charge

UK

By visiting the UK.gov website you can find out various things about almost any UK registered vehicle including:

when its current vehicle tax expires

when its MOT expires

the date it was first registered

SORN status

colour

engine size

year of manufacture

CO2 emissions

current vehicle tax rate

You can also request details of a vehicle's registered keeper and certain other information from DVLA if you have 'reasonable cause'. You can also request information held by DVLA about you.

Why you might make a request 'Reasonable cause' can include:

Accident investigation

Owner of an abandoned vehicle

locating the owner of a vehicle illegally parked on private land

Parking tickets

Finding people responsible for driving off without paying for goods and services

You can request details of a vehicle's registered keeper, information about previous keepers for a vehicle now registered in your name, information DVLA holds about you

You only need the registration number will provide MOT details including any faults found or warnings given

USA Vehicle information

NICB's VIN Check service is provided free to assist in determining if a vehicle has been reported as stolen, but not recovered, or listed as a salvage vehicle by NICB member insurance companies. To complete a search, the (VIN) <u>Vehicle Identification Number</u> is needed.

The VIN is a 17 digit internationally recognised number that must be inputted correctly to get the required information.

Five searches can be conducted within a 24-hour period per IP address.
